QUAINT

Parts of Speech : **Adj.**

Meaning : **attractively unusual or old-fashioned**

Synonyms : **picturesque, charming, old-fashioned**

Antonyms : **fashionable, modern, stylish**

Sentence : **A quaint general store on one of the back roads of Vermont.**



HOLLERING

Parts of Speech : **Verb**

Meaning : **(of a person) give a loud shout or cry**

Synonyms : **shout, yell, cry**

Antonyms : **mumbling, murmuring, whispering**

Sentence : **Hollering at me isn't going to find us a parking place.**



TEMPTING

Parts of Speech : **Adj.**

Meaning : **appealing to or attracting someone, even if wrong or inadvisable.**

Synonyms : **enticing, alluring, attractive**

Antonyms : **boring, irksome, tedious**

Sentence : **And maybe, I don't want you tempting me to do something I shouldn't.**



EXUDED

Parts of Speech : **Verb**

Meaning : to flow forth slowly through small openings

Synonyms : **give off/out, discharge, release**

Antonyms : gushed, poured

Sentence : A sticky resin exudes from the bark of the tree.



REVILE

Meaning : criticize in an abusive or angrily insulting manner

Synonyms: criticize, censure, condemn

Antonyms: acclaim, applaud, praise
commend

POS : Verb

Sentence : They feared that he would revile them if they displeased him.



PENSIVE

Meaning : engaged in, involving, or
reflecting deep or serious thought

Contemplative
Musing

Synonyms: thoughtful, thinking, reflective

Antonyms: unreflective, thoughtless

POS.: Adj.

Sentence : She looked pensive when she
heard the news.



PROFFERING

Proposal
प्रस्ताव

Meaning : To offer or present something to someone for acceptance or consideration ; to extend or propose

Synonyms: Propound , Tender

Antonyms: Revoke , Retain

POS : Verb

Sentence : He was proffering his help to the community by volunteering at the local shelter.



FEROCITY

Violent

Meaning : **A quality of being very aggressive , intense**

Synonyms: **Barbarity , Severity ,**

Antonyms: **Meekness , Compassion**

POS : **Noun**

Sentence : **The ferocity of wild animal's attack left everyone in shock.**



FILLIP

Meaning : A sudden stimulus or boost that provides energy or encouragement

Synonyms: Spur, Impetus, Uplift

Antonyms: Setback, Impediment

POS : **Noun**

Sentence : The positive feedback from his boss gave him the fillip he needed to complete the project with enthusiasm.



DENT

Meaning : A shallow depression or hollow usually caused by an impact or pressure.

Synonyms: Cavity , Defect

Antonyms: Bulge , Mound , Peak

POS : **Verb**

Sentence : **The car's fender had a dent from the minor Collision with another vehicle**
