Lethal (adj.)

Meaning : **likely to cause or capable of causing death**

Synonyms : **deadly, fatal, poisonous**

Robust

Antonyms : **healthy, nonlethal, beneficial**

Sentence : **All these knives are absolutely lethal.**



Cachinnation (noun)

Meaning : as in laughter

हसित

Synonyms : chuckle, giggle

Antonyms : cry, groan, wail

Complain in a loud manner

Sentence : He starts Cachinnation very fast after watching comedy shows.

Saucous laughter

to laugh
loudly
immoderately



Plethora (noun)

Meaning : an amount or supply more than sufficient to meet one's needs

Synonyms : plenty, abundance, wealth

Antonyms : deficiency, insufficiency, *Shortage/deficit* inadequacy)

Sentence : There's a plethora of books about the royal family.



Munificence (noun)

उदारता

Meaning : **the quality or state of being generous**

Synonyms : **kindness, generosity, bountifulness**

Antonyms : **selfishness, cheapness, meanness**

Sentence : **A number of poor communities now have school computers as a result of that billionaire's munificence**



Irascible (adj.)

Meaning : **easily irritated or annoyed**

Synonyms: **irritable, fiery, peevish**

Antonyms: **affable, gregarious, friendly**

Sentence : ^{She is} **forced to endure a memorably irascible boss on her first job after college**

Obsolete (adj.) / *Scrap*

Meaning : **having passed its time of use or usefulness**

Synonyms: archaic, antiquated, medieval

Antonyms: modern, new, current

Sentence : New technology has rendered my old computer obsolete.



Banal (adj.)

Meaning : **used or heard so often as to be dull**

Synonyms: **boring, usual, tired**

Antonyms: **new, original, fresh**

Sentence : **The allegations ranged from the banal to the bizarre**

Meaning : **a state of noisy, confused activity**

Effect

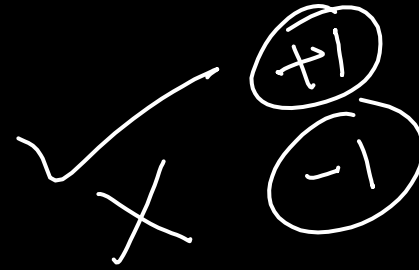
Sentence : **It is difficult to convey the gist of Reich's ideas simply.**
