## Fealty (noun)

Meaning : **adherence to something to which one is bound by a pledge or duty**

Synonyms : **allegiance, commitment, dedication**

Antonyms : **treachery, disloyalty, perfidy**

Sentence : **He swore fealty to the king.**

अपमानजनक Invidious (adj.)

Meaning : (of an action or situation)  
likely to arouse or incur resentment or  
anger in others.

Synonyms : envious, malicious, covetous

Antonyms : generous, charitable kind

Sentence : Such a difficult choice placed him  
in an invidious position.



## **Shtick (noun)**

**Meaning : a performance regularly presented by an individual or group**

**Synonyms : act, routine, performance**

**Sentence : His shtick as a falling-down drunk isn't funny to people battling alcoholism.**



अड्डा **Affray (noun)**

Meaning : an instance of fighting in a public place that disturbs the peace.

Synonyms : brawl, fight, confrontation

Antonyms : silence, calm

Sentence : He was charged with causing an affray.





## Pithy (adj.)

Meaning : **marked by the use of few words to convey much information or meaning**

Synonyms : **concise, brief, summary**

Antonyms : **wordy, lengthy, verbose**

more than required

Sentence : **Press releases must be short and pithy.**

## **Fete (noun)**

**Meaning :** a time or program of special events and entertainment in honor of something

**Synonyms:** celebration, jamboree, fest

**Sentence :** Despite the bad weather the fete will go ahead.

## Penitence (noun)

Meaning : **the action of feeling or showing sorrow and regret for having done wrong; repentance.**

Synonyms: **remorse, guilt, regret**

Antonyms: **impenitence, remorselessness**

Sentence : **He expressed suitable penitence for what he had done**



शुद्ध **Filibuster (verb)**

Meaning : a tactic for delaying or obstructing legislation by making long speeches

Synonyms: stonewall, blocking, hindrance

Sentence : Opponents of the bill  
threatened to filibuster its final stages.

## Consigliere (noun)

Meaning : **a person who gives advice especially professionally**

Synonyms: **adviser, consultant, counselor**

Antonyms: **counselee**

Sentence : **Barry was the president's trusted consigliere and chief political strategist.**



शुद्धता

## Hearsay (noun)

Meaning : **information received from other people that one cannot adequately substantiate; rumor.**

Synonyms: **rumor, gossip, whisper**

Antonyms – evidence

Sentence : **Her judgments are based on hearsay rather than evidence.**

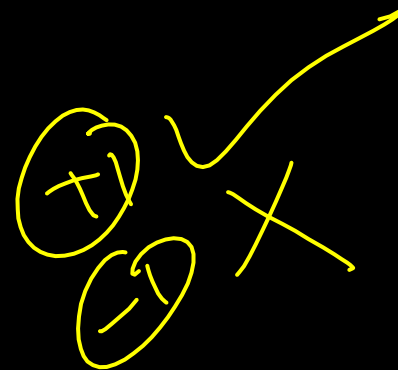
