FODDER

Parts of Speech : Noun

Meaning : **food that is given to farm animals**

Synonyms : **Forage , Silage**

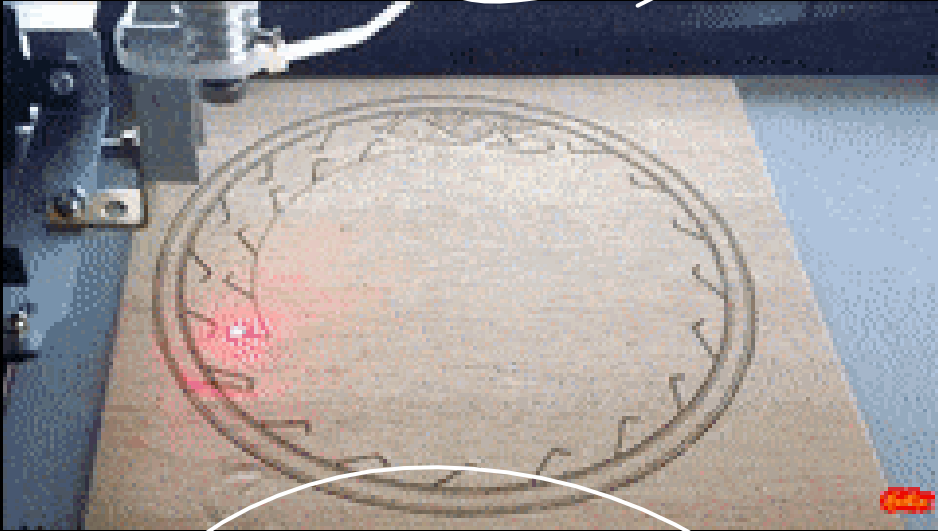
Antonyms : **Abstain , Deny**

Sentence : **In winter, cattle eat fodder which lacks the pigment and dairy products are naturally paler.**

Parts of Speech : **Verb**

Meaning : **to cut words or designs on metal, stone, etc.**

Synonyms : **Carve , Inscribe**

Antonyms : **Obliterate , Expunge**

Sentence : **She had the ring engraved with her initials.**

INCURSION

Parts of Speech : **Noun**

Meaning : **a sudden attack by foreign armies etc., usually across international borders**

Synonyms : **Aggression , Attack**

Antonyms : **Retreat**

Sentence : **The rebels made frequent incursions into the area controlled by the government.**



EXPEDITIOUS

Parts of Speech : **Adj.**

Meaning : **done with speed and efficiency.**

Synonyms : **Speedy , Swift**

Antonyms : **Slow**

Sentence : **The judge said that arbitration was a fair and expeditious decision-making process.**





COMMUNIQUE

Meaning : an official statement, especially from a government, a political group, etc.

Synonyms: Bulletin , Missive

Antonyms: Secret , Concealment

POS : Noun

Sentence : The palace has issued a communiqué denying the rumour.

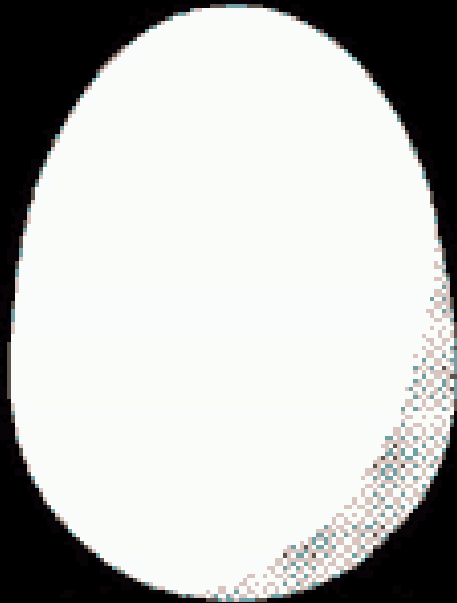


INCUBATION

Meaning : a process of development

Synonyms: Evolution , Maturation

Antonyms: Regress , Lapse



Sentence : This may be due to active consumption of glyoxylate during incubation of the samples.



STAMPEDE



Meaning : **a situation where a large group of frightened animals, esp. horses or cattle**

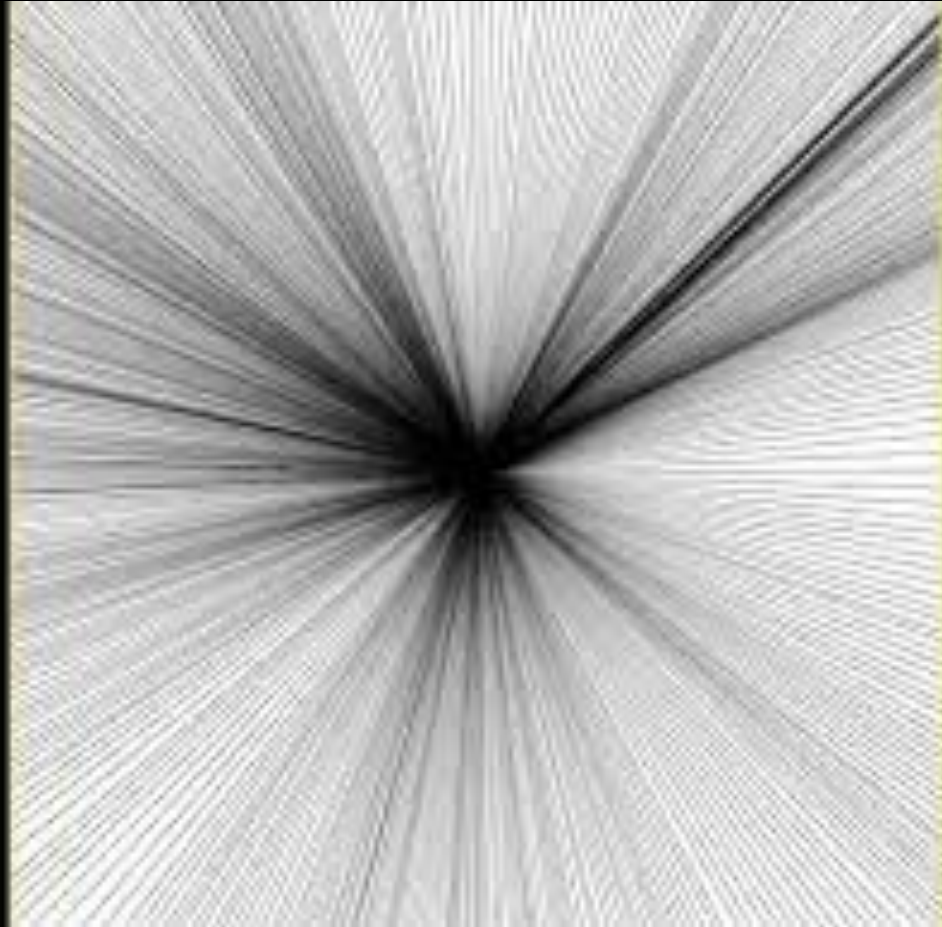
Synonyms: **Panic , Scattering**

POS : **Noun**

Sentence : **The crowd stampeded and many were crushed or trampled underfoot.**



CONVERGENCE



Parts of Speech : **Noun**

Meaning : **the meeting or merging of things that were previously separate or distinct, resulting in a shared focus**

Synonyms : **Conflux , Junction**

Antonyms : **Dispersal , Deviation**

Sentence : **The convergence of various cultures at the international festival showcased the beauty of diversity.**



DENOVO

Parts of Speech : **Adj. and Adverb**

Meaning : **starting over or from the beginning.**

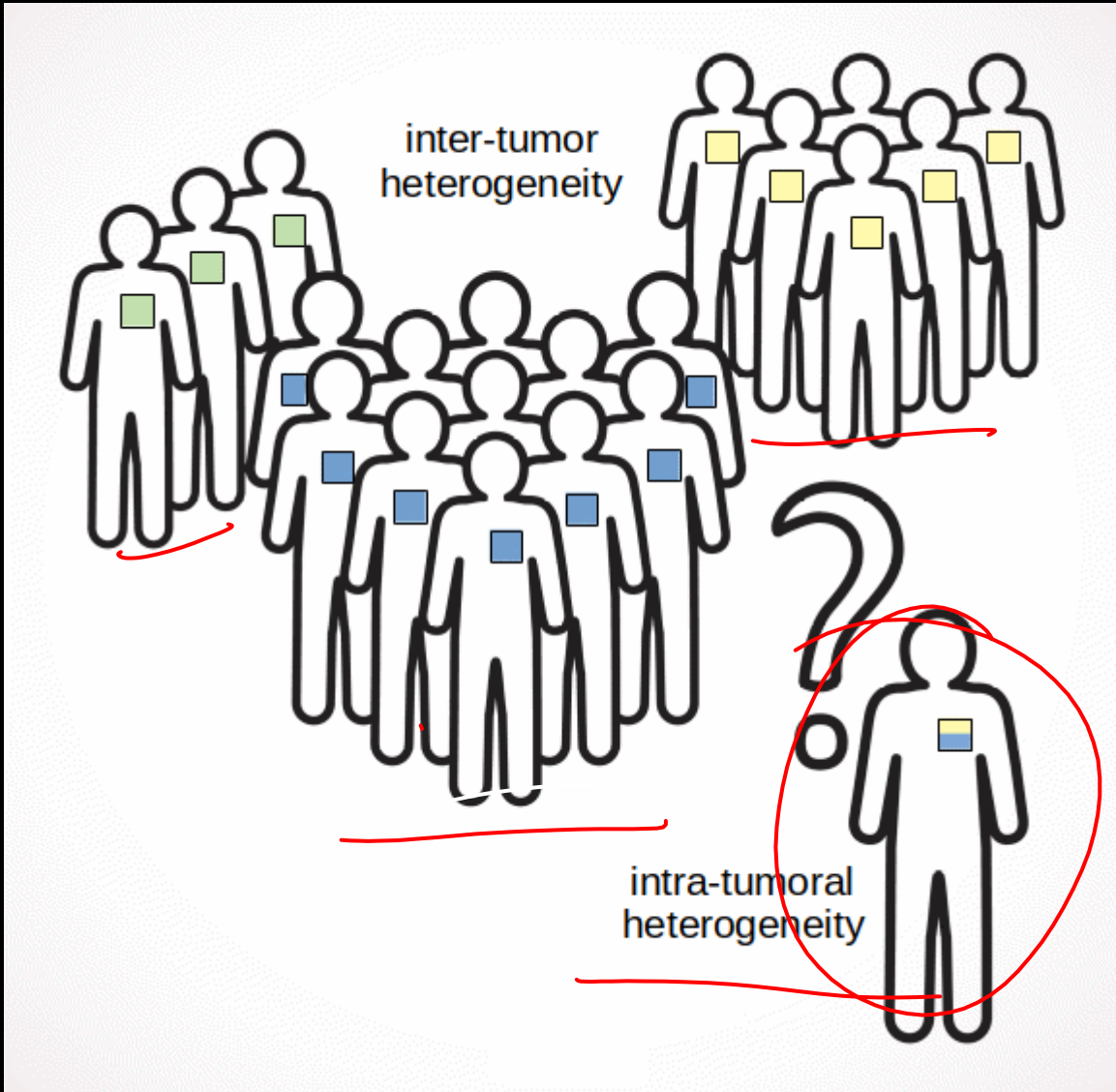
Synonyms : **Anew , Again**

Antonyms : **Incessantly , Persistently**

Sentence : **The research team took a denovo approach to solving the problem, breaking away from traditional methods.**

The legal team decided to present the case denovo to ensure a fair trial for the defendant.





HETEROGENEITY

Parts of Speech : **Noun**

Meaning : **The presence of various distinct elements, differences, or variations within a larger whole**

Synonyms : **Assortment , Mixture**

Antonyms : **Conformity , Uniformity**

Sentence : **The economic challenges faced by the region were exacerbated by the heterogeneity of industries and income levels.**



DRUDGERY

Meaning : **Dull, repetitive, or menial tasks that are often considered tedious and uninteresting.**

Synonyms: **Tedium , Routine**

Antonyms: **Variety , Stimulation**

POS: **Noun**

Sentence : **The endless drudgery of commuting took a toll on his overall well-being.**

SHUDDERING

Meaning : A sudden and brief convulsive movement.

Synonyms: Tremors , quivering

Antonyms: Composure , Steadiness

POS : Verb

Sentence : The artist intentionally incorporated dissonance into his artwork to evoke a sense of unease and contemplation.



EXORBITANT



Meaning : Unreasonably high or excessive, especially in terms of price, cost, or demand.

Synonyms: **Extravagant , Inflated**

Antonyms: **Sensible , Moderate**

POS : **Adj.**

Sentence : She was shocked by the exorbitant fees charged by the designer for a custom-made gown.



FURORE

Parts of Speech : Noun

Meaning : A state of intense excitement, anger, or controversy

Synonyms : Outrage , Uproar

Antonyms : Calmness

Sentence : The sudden increase in prices of essential goods led to a furore among the consumers, prompting calls for government intervention.





VEXATIOUS



Parts of Speech : **Adj.**

Meaning : **Causing annoyance, frustration, or distress, often persistently or repeatedly.**

Synonyms : **Annoying , Irritating** *Unpleasant*

Antonyms : **Pleasant**

Sentence : **Dealing with the faulty internet connection on a daily basis was a vexatious issue for the remote workers.**



EXPULSION



Parts of Speech : **Noun**

Meaning : **The act of forcing someone to leave a place, organization, or group, often as a disciplinary action.**

Synonyms : **Ejection , Eviction**

Antonyms : **Admission**

Sentence : **The company announced the expulsion of the employee who was found guilty of leaking confidential information.**



ASTOUNDING

Parts of Speech : **Adj.**

Meaning : **Extremely surprising or shocking**

Synonyms : **Incredible , Stunning**

Antonyms : **Mundane , Expected**

Sentence : **The transformation of the old, dilapidated building into a luxurious hotel was nothing short of astounding.**



ABSOLUTELY ASTONISHING!



MISCREANT

Meaning : **A person who behaves badly or engages in immoral or criminal activities; a wrongdoer or villain.**

Synonyms: **Delinquent, Outlaw**

Antonyms: **Philanthropist**

POS : **Noun**

Sentence : **The detective worked tirelessly to uncover the miscreant behind the corporate fraud scheme that had drained millions from the company's accounts.**





WEATHERED

Meaning : **Survived or endured,**

Weather **Altered or changed due to exposure**

Synonyms: **Overcome , Faded**

Antonyms: **Succumbed , Pristine**

POS : **Verb and Adj.**

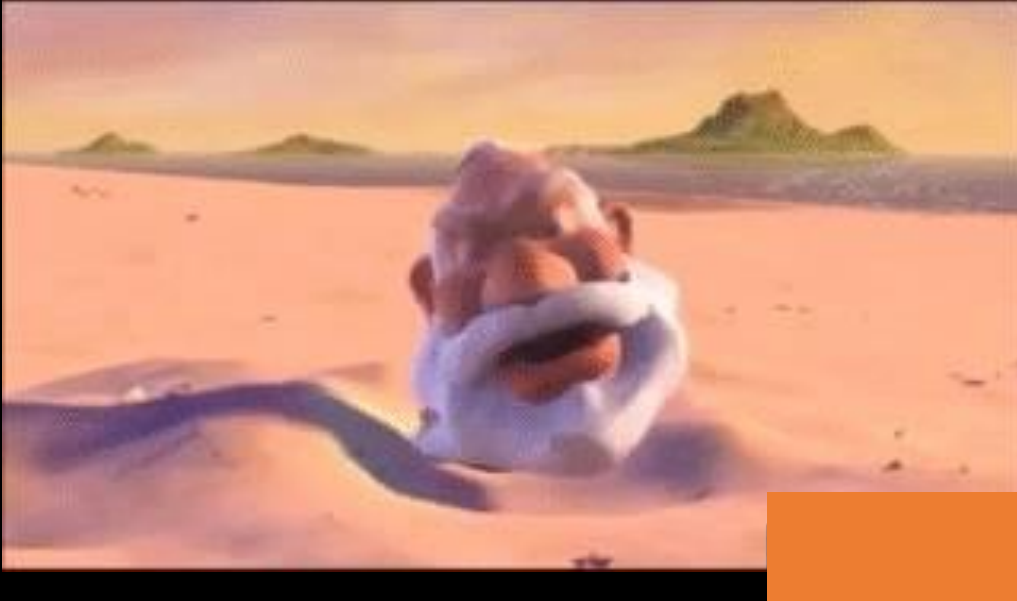
Sentence : **Despite facing numerous challenges, the small business weathered the storm and eventually became successful.**

The sailor's weathered face told the story of his years spent at sea, battling the elements.





4. ATROCITY (Noun)



Meaning: A heinous or monstrous action that causes great suffering or harm to others.

Cruelty

Synonyms: Barbarity , Brutality

Antonyms: Kindness , Decency

Sentence: The atrocity committed against innocent civilians during the war shocked the entire world.



8. INTERCEPT(Verb)



Meaning: To stop or seize something that is in motion or on its way from one place to another.

Synonyms: Ambush , Obstruct

Antonyms: Permit , Free

Sentence: The security forces managed to intercept the smugglers and seize the illegal goods.
