





Aditya-L1 gives India's space programme one more boundary to push

oughly a week after the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) soft-landed a robotic lander and rover on the moon's south polar region, it launched India's first space mission dedicated to studying the sun, in the form of a spacecraft named Aditya-L1. Barely half a day after the launch, ISRO announced that its lunar rover had completed the surface studies it had planned and that it had been "parked" ahead of the two-week-long lunar night. This vignette illustrates a certain maturity on the part of the Ipdian space programme: it enters a phase where its growth from strength to strength becomes indistinguishable from international leadership in space exploration, even as it carries forward an old tradition of studying the sun, exemplified by




