VOCABULARY

ANEURYSM

Parts of Speech: NOUN

Meaning: A localized, abnormal, and weak bulging of an artery wall, often resulting from a weakening of the blood vessel's wall.

Synonym: Aortic dilation, arterial bulge, vascular dilatation

Antonym: Normal artery, healthy blood vessel Example Sentence: The patient was rushed to the hospital after experiencing severe pain, which turned out to be caused by an aneurysm.

CUE

Parts of Speech: VERB

Meaning: To give a signal or prompt to initiate an

action or event.

Synonym: Signal, prompt, direct, guide

Antonym: Confuse, mislead, hinder

Example Sentence:

The conductor will cue the orchestra before the musical performance begins.

REPRISING

Parts of Speech: VERB

Meaning: Repeating or performing something, especially a musical piece or role, for a second time or on a subsequent occasion.

Synonym: Repeating, revisiting, reenacting, redoing

Antonym: Abandoning, discontinuing, foregoing

Example Sentence: The actor will be reprising his

role as the iconic character in the sequel.

ADVOCATED

Parts of Speech: **VERB**

Meaning: To publicly support or recommend a particular cause, policy, or idea; to argue in favor of something.

Synonym: Support, champion, endorse, promote

Antonym: Oppose, challenge, resist, discourage

Example Sentence: The environmentalist advocated

for sustainable practices to protect the ecosystem.

GRAMMYS

Parts of Speech: Noun

Meaning: The Grammys, short for the Grammy

Awards, refers to an annual awards ceremony presented by the Recording Academy to recognize

outstanding achievements in the music industry.

Synonym: Grammy Awards, music awards, accolades

Example Sentence: Several artists were nominated for Grammys this year, showcasing their contributions to the music industry.

SURPASSING

Parts of Speech: ADJ.

Meaning: Excelling or exceeding others in quality, degree, extent, or significance; going beyond what is usual or expected.

Synonym: Outstanding, exceptional, superior, transcendent

Antonym: Inferior, subpar, ordinary, mediocre Example Sentence: The chef received acclaim for his surpassing culinary skills, creating dishes that were truly extraordinary.

MELANCHOLIC

Parts of Speech: ADJ.

Meaning: Expressing a feeling of deep sadness or sorrow; characterized by a thoughtful or pensive mood.

Synonym: Sorrowful, mournful, pensive, gloomy

Antonym: Cheerful, joyful, exuberant, happy

Example Sentence: The melancholic music played softly in the background, reflecting the somber atmosphere of the scene.



ACCLAIM

Parts of Speech: NOUN/VERB

Meaning: Enthusiastic approval or praise, especially when expressed publicly.

(Verb): To praise enthusiastically and publicly.

Synonym: Praise, applause, commendation, recognition

Antonym: Criticism, disapproval, condemnation,

censure

Example Sentence: The film received critical acclaim for its powerful performances and compelling storyline. The renowned author was acclaimed for her contributions to literature.

PERCUSSIONIST

Parts of Speech: **NOUN**

Meaning: A musician who plays percussion

instruments, such as drums, cymbals, and xylophones,

in a musical performance or ensemble.

Synonym: drummer, rhythmist, beat-keeper,

drummer boy (informal)

Antonyms: wind instrumentalist, string

instrumentalist

Example Sentence: The percussionist added a rhythmic intensity to the band's performance with skillful drumming.

ACCOLADE

Parts of Speech: **NOUN**

Meaning: An expression of praise, approval, or honor; an award or privilege granted as a special acknowledgment of merit.

Synonym: honor, tribute, commendation, recognition

Antonym: criticism, censure, disapproval

Example Sentence: The author received numerous accolades for her outstanding contribution to literature.

PHRASAL VERBS

ACCOMPANIED BY: To be joined by someone in an activity or task

PULLED UP FOR: Criticized or reprimanded

IDIOM & PHRASES

TOOK THE STAGE: To begin a performance in front of the audience

PAID TRIBUTE TO: To show respect to someone
