




NON-FINITE VERBS


- A non-finite verb (also known as a verbal) is the term used to describe a verb that is not showing tense.
- It a verb form which is not acting like a verb but noun/adjective.
- There are three types of non-finite verbs:

1. Participle 2. Gerund 3. Infinitive

<u>Participles - (Act as an Adjective)</u>

A participle is a word formed from a verb, usually by adding -d, -ed, or -ing.

There are mainly two but three kinds of participle, as follows:

The present participle: Ex:

The past participle:

The past participle ends with -ed, -d, -t, -en, or -n

Ex:


The <u>risen</u> sun The <u>broken</u> news

The perfect Participle:

Perfect participles are formed like this: "Having" + [past

participle]

Ex: Having heard the news, he quickly sold his brother's record collection.
