

SOME IMPORTANT RULES OF ADVERB

Rule-1:

We use an adverb of frequency such as always, often, never, ever, sometimes, generally, usually, seldom, hardly, rarely etc. before the verb they modify.

- He often plays every week.
- > They never tried to do better in life.

Rule-3: Uses of 'Else' and 'Other'. 'Else' should be followed by 'but'. 'other' and 'otherwise' are followed by 'than'.

Rule-4: We should use the adverb 'as' to introduce predicative of the verbs like regard, describe, view, know etc. We should not use adverb 'as' to introduce predicative of verbs like name, elect, think, call, make, choose etc.

- > He is considered the best actor of Bollywood.
- > He regards me as his brother.



IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF ADVERB

Rule 5: We should not use negative adverbs like seldom, nowhere, never, nothing, barely, merely, neither, rarely etc. with the negative meaning words. Two negative words should be avoided.

- I rarely go to meet anybody in the city.
- > They hardly know anybody in the college.





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF ADVERB

Rule 6: If the sentence is beginning with hardly, never, seldom, scarcely, rarely, no sooner etc. then the verb is used in inversion form.

Ex:

- > No sooner had they entered the theatre than the movie started. (Correct)s
- Hardly does he go to gym. (Correct)









IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF ADVERB

Rule 7: The adverb of Manner, Place and Time should be placed after the verb or the object and the order should be: "manner + place+ time".

- Raman carefully read the book yesterday, at home. (wrong)
- Raman read the book carefully at home yesterday. (correct)





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF ADVERB

Rule 8: Do not use a preposition before an adverb:

With most humbly I rest my case. (wrong)

Most humbly I rest my case. (correct)

- Ravi deals with firmly and with boldly. (wrong)
- Ravi deals firmly and boldly. (correct)





IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF ADVERB

Rule 9: Do not use the adverb 'never' in place of the adverb 'not'

Arjun met Karan after his rebirth but Karan never recognized him. (wrong)

Arjun met Karan after his rebirth but Karan did not recognize him. (right)


