ASIA

- Asia, the world's largest and most diverse continent.
- It occupies the eastern four-fifths of the giant Eurasian landmass

• Asia is bounded by the Arctic Ocean to the north, the Pacific Ocean to the east, the Indian Ocean to the south, the Red Sea (as well as the inland seas of the Atlantic Ocean—the Mediterranean and the Black) to the southwest, and Europe to the west.

 Asia is separated from North America to the northeast by the Bering Strait and from Australia to the southeast by the seas and straits connecting the Indian and Pacific oceans.

- The Isthmus of Suez unites Asia with Africa, and it is generally agreed that the Suez Canal forms the border between them.
- Two narrow straits, the Bosporus and the Dardanelles, separate Anatolia from the Balkan Peninsula.

- The tallest peak in the world, Mount Everest,
- the lowest place on Earth's land surface, the Dead Sea,
- world's deepest continental trough, occupied by Lake Baikal, below sea level, are all located in Asia.

AFRICA

- Africa, the second largest continent covering about one-fifth of the total land surface of Earth.
- The continent is bounded on the west by the Atlantic Ocean, on the north by the Mediterranean Sea, on the east by the Red Sea and the Indian Ocean, and on the south by the mingling waters of the Atlantic and Indian oceans.

- The continent is cut almost equally in two by the Equator, so that most of Africa lies within the tropical region, bounded on the north by the Tropic of Cancer and on the south by the Tropic of Capricorn.
- Africa is crossed from north to south by the prime meridian (0° longitude), which passes a short distance to the east of Accra, Ghana.

NORTH AMERICA

• North America, third largest of the world's continents

- North America is bounded on the north by the Arctic Ocean, on the east by the North Atlantic Ocean, on the south by the Caribbean Sea, and on the west by the North Pacific Ocean.
- To the northeast Greenland is separated from Iceland by the Denmark Strait, and to the northwest <u>Alaska</u> is separated from the Asian mainland by the much narrower Bering Strait.

- North America's only land connection is to South America at the narrow Isthmus of Panama.
- Mount McKinley in Alaska, rising 6,190 metres above sea level, is the continent's highest point, and Death Valley in California, at 86 metres below sea level, is its lowest.

SOUTH AMERICA

South America, fourth largest of the world's continents

• South America is bounded by the Caribbean Sea to the northwest and north, the Atlantic Ocean to the northeast, east, and southeast, and the Pacific Ocean to the west.

 In the northwest it is joined to North America by the Isthmus of Panama

 Drake Passage, south of Cape Horn, separates South America from Antarctica.

- South America has a total area roughly one-eighth of the land surface of Earth.
- At 6,959 metres above sea level, Mount Aconcagua, in Argentina, near the border with Chile, is not only the continent's highest point but also the highest elevation in the Western Hemisphere.
- The Valdés Peninsula, on the southeastern coast of Argentina, includes the lowest point, at 40 metres below sea level.

ANTARCTICA

- Antarctica, the world's southernmost and fifth largest continent. Its landmass is almost wholly covered by a vast ice sheet.
- Antarctica is the world's southernmost continent.
- It is the world's highest, driest, windiest, coldest, and iciest continent.
- Thick ice covers about 98 percent of the land.

EUROPE

• Europe, second smallest of the world's continents, and occupying nearly one-fifteenth of the world's total land area.

• It is bordered on the north by the Arctic Ocean, on the west by the Atlantic Ocean, and on the south (west to east) by the Mediterranean Sea, the Black Sea, the Kuma-Manych Depression, and the Caspian Sea.

AUSTRALIA

• Australia, the smallest continent and one of the largest countries on Earth.

- Australia is separated from Indonesia to the northwest by the Timor and Arafura seas,
- from Papua New Guinea to the northeast by the Coral Sea and the Torres Strait,
- from the Coral Sea Islands Territory by the Great Barrier Reef,
- from New Zealand to the southeast by the Tasman Sea, and
- from Antarctica in the far south by the Indian Ocean

- Australia has been called "the Oldest Continent," "the Last of Lands," and "the Last Frontier.
- Canberra is the capital of Australia and the Australian Dollar is the official currency of this country.
