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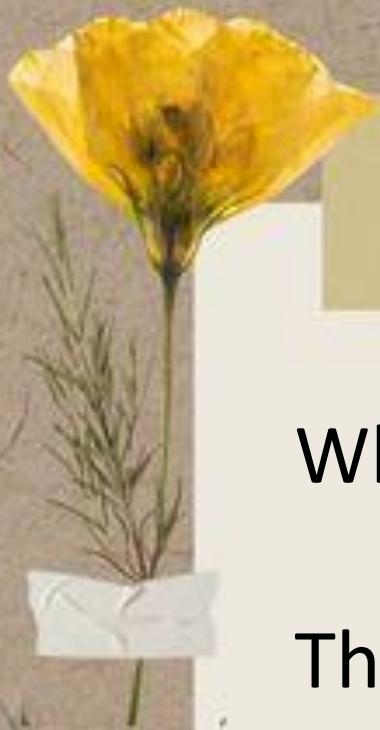
RELATIVE PRONOUN

- ❑ A **relative pronoun** is a word that introduces a dependent (or relative) clause and connects it to an independent clause.
 - ❑ The most common relative pronouns are **who, whom, whose, which, that**.
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**DIFFERENCE BETWEEN
RELATIVE PRONOUN
AND
INTERROGATIVE PRONOUN**





Whom did you speak to?

The boy whom i spoke yesterday was absent .

Who are you?

I asked the girl who she was ?

- **In the presence of word such**

You are such a person who can help everyone.

- **In the presence of word ‘the same’**

He is the same man who always likes to boast of his bravery

- **In the presence of only**

Only those who were present in the party participated in the game .

This is the only way which can be accepted by everyone.



▪ **In the presence of all**

These are all the slanderous statements which deteriorates his character .
