1. Catastrophic (Adjective) : विनाशकारी

Meaning: causing sudden and very great harm or destruction

Synonyms: disastrous fatal, unfortunate, calamitous, destructive, ruinous, fateful, cataclysmic

Antonyms: fortunate, advantageous, anastrophic, beneficial

Sentence: The earthquake had a catastrophic impact on the city, causing widespread destruction and loss of life.

2. Abridgment (Noun): संक्षिप्रीकरण

Meaning: a shortened or condensed version of a written or spoken work

Antonyms: expansion, elaboration

Sentence: The abridgment of the novel was much easier to read than the full version, which was over 1,000 pages long.


3. Trumpeted (Verb): घोषणा करना

Meaning: to make known openly or publicly

Synonyms: announced, published, proclaimed, declared, publicize

Antonyms: withheld, suppressed, concealed, hide

Sentence: We trumpeted our triumph all over the college.

5. Agog (Adjective): उत्सुक

Meaning: very eager or curious to hear or see something

Antonyms: apathetic, unenthusiastic, uninterested

Sentence: The children were agog to see the circus performance.

6. Callous (Adjective) : कठोर, निर्दयी

Meaning: showing or having an insensitive and cruel disregard for others

Synonyms: ruthless, merciless, heartless, cruel, unfeeling

Antonyms: sympathetic, compassionate, merciful

Sentence: The professor was callous and cold, and no one wanted to remain in the class.

7. Ebullient (Adjective): जोश, उल्लासित

Meaning: cheerful and full of energy

Antonyms: indolent, lazy, sluggish, depressed, gloomy

Sentence: The children were ebullient at the prospect of going to Disneyland.

8. Exculpate (Verb) : निर्दोष सिद्ध करना

Meaning: show or declare that (someone) is not guilty of wrongdoing

Synonyms: absolve, acquit, clear, exonerate, vindicate

Antonyms: blame, accuse, condemn, convict

Sentence: The evidence presented in court was enough to exculpate the accused and prove their innocence.

9. Decry (Verb): निंदा करना

Meaning: publicly denounce; to criticize something as bad, without value, or unnecessary

Synonyms: criticize, denigrate, denounce, condemn

Antonyms: laud, praise, extol

Sentence: The opposition party leaders decry the government's new policy, calling it a disaster for the country.




10. Trample (Verb) : रौंदना

Meaning: tread on and crush; to step heavily on something or someone, causing damage or injury

Synonyms: walk over, crush, smash
