1. Medallion (Noun): पदक, चिन्ह

Meaning: A flat, typically circular metal piece with an inscription or design, often worn as a decoration or an award.

Synonyms: badge, decoration, emblem, insignia, token

Sentence: The president awarded a gold medallion to the athlete for his exceptional performance in the Olympic Games.






Meaning: Showing or suffering from nervousness, fear, or a lack of confidence.

Synonyms: fearful, apprehensive, timid, shy, hesitant

Antonyms: bold, brave, courageous, confident, fearless

Sentence: Despite feeling timorous, she mustered up the courage to face her fears and speak in front of a large audience.





Meaning: of vital importance; crucial

Synonyms: Essential, crucial, necessary, vital

Antonyms: optional, unimportant, unnecessary

Sentence: Self-discipline and persistence are two of the imperative qualities to have for anyone who is serious about being successful in life.



🥯 4. Parse (Verb): वाक्यविक्लेषण करना

Meaning: To analyze or examine, typically by breaking it down into its parts

Synonyms: Analyze, dissect, examine, scrutinize, study

Antonyms: Combine, merge, join, integrate, synthesize

Sentence: In order to fully understand the meaning of the sentence, you need to parse it.





5. Laggard (Adjective): आलसी, सुस्त

Meaning: something that is slow or sluggish in movement or progress (slower than desired or expected)

Synonyms: slow, lagging, sluggish

Antonyms: prompt, swift, agile, active

Sentence: The company's laggard progress in implementing new technology put them at a disadvantage compared to its competitors.





6. Catapult (Noun,Verb): गुलेल

Meaning: A device used to hurl or launch objects over a distance; to launch or propel something or someone

Synonyms: Launch, Fling, Propel

Antonyms: Stop, Halt, Hold, Keep

Sentence: The company plans to catapult its sales with a new marketing campaign.





7. Emanate (Verb): ਤੁਪਤ

Meaning: originate from; be produced by; to express a quality or feeling through the way that you look and behave

Synonyms: emerge, arise, originate, Stem, derive

Sentence: At the party, the music will emanate from the speakers and fill the entire room.





8. Coalition (Noun) : गठबंधन

Meaning: an alliance for combined action, especially of political parties forming a government

Synonyms: alliance, association, union

Antonyms: disassociation, division

Sentence: At length, the contest was finally closed by a coalition of the three rivals.





9. Put someone in the shade (Idiom)

Meaning: to be so good that another person or thing does not seem important or worth very much

Synonyms: surpass, outshine, overshadow, be head and shoulders above

Sentence: Although I thought I'd done well, my sister's exam results put mine in the shade.





10. A Bitter Pill To Swallow (Idiom)

Meaning: accepting an unpleasant or painful truth or situation

Synonyms: Hard truth, unpleasant reality, tough situation.

Sentence: Losing his job was a bitter pill to swallow, but he knew he had to accept it and move on.
