

े. Rapprochement (Noun): मेल-मिलाप

Meaning: The reestablishment of cordial relations, or resumption of harmonious relations.

Synonyms: Reconciliation, Harmonization, Accord, Agreement

Antonyms: Conflict, Hostility, Disagreement

Sentence: The recent talks between the two nations have led to a rapprochement, improving diplomatic relations.





2. Insuperable (Adj.) : अविजेय

Meaning: Impossible to overcome or defeat

Synonyms: Unbeatable, Invincible, Indomitable, Unsurmountable

Antonyms: Surmountable, Conquerable, Overcomeable, Achievable

Sentence: The challenges she faced seemed insuperable, but she never gave up and eventually succeeded.



🥞. Apprentice (Noun): शिक्षु

Meaning: A person who is learning a trade or profession under a skilled worker, typically for a fixed period of time as part of a formal agreement.

Synonyms: Trainee, Learner, Novice

Antonyms: Expert, Master, Veteran, Professional

Sentence: She joined a renowned chef as an apprentice to gain practical experience in the culinary field.





4. Edacious (Adj.): भुक्खड़

Meaning: Having a huge appetite or craving for food; devouring or consuming in large quantities.

Synonyms: Voracious, Greedy, Gluttonous, Ravenous

Sentence: The edacious teenager finished the entire pizza by himself in just a few minutes.





5. Alley (Noun): गली

Meaning: A narrow passage or lane, usually between buildings, often used for walking

Synonyms: Lane, Pathway, Passage, Walkway, Corridor

Antonyms: Open space, Boulevard, Avenue

Sentence: The children played basketball in the alley behind their house.





6. Gargantuan (Adj.): विशाल

Meaning: unusually large

Synonyms: enormous, massive, giant

Antonyms: little, mini, petite

Sentence: Of all her mistakes, this was the most gargantuan.





7. Arsenal (Noun) : शस्त्रागार

Meaning: a place where military arms are stored

Synonyms: armory, warehouse, depot

Sentence: They sent the ordinance officer to the arsenal for weapons.





8. Fudge (Verb): ਠਾਜਾ

Meaning: to use dishonest methods to achieve a goal

Synonyms: cheat, finagle, falsify

Sentence: She's been fudging on her taxes for years.





9. Play It By Ear (Idiom)

Meaning: to decide how to deal with a situation as it develops, rather than acting according to plans made earlier

Synonyms: Wing it

Antonym: Follow a plan

Sentence: I'm not sure what time the party starts, so I'll just have to play it by ear and see when everyone else arrives.





10. Put The Cart Before The Horse (Idiom)

Meaning: to do things in the wrong order, or to prioritize things incorrectly.

Synonyms: to reverse the order, to get things backward

Antonym: to prioritize correctly of whole-pic order

Sentence: Aren't you putting the cart before the horse by deciding what to wear for the wedding before you've even been invited to it?







Meaning: Proclivity means a natural tendency to do something or be attracted to something, while predisposition means a tendency to behave or think a certain way.



Meaning: Propinquity means nearness in place or time, while nearness means the state of being close to something or someone.


