# WORDS WITH PICTURE



#### 1. Sedition (Noun) : देशद्रोह

Meaning: Conduct or speech inciting rebellion against the authority of a state or monarch.

Synonyms: Rebellion, Treason, Insurrection, Mutiny

Antonyms: Loyalty, Obedience (†)

Sentence: The government arrested the individuals involved in sedition for their attempts to overthrow the established regime.



#### 2. Abeyance (Noun) : स्थगित

Meaning: Temporary suspension or cessation of activity or condition.

Synonyms: Suspension, Dormancy, Inactivity

Antonyms: Continuation, Resumption, Activity

Sentence: The project is currently in abeyance due to funding issues, but it is expected to resume once the financial situation improves.





The Law Commission's recommendation that the offence of sedition be retained in penal law, albeit with some safeguards, flies in the face of current judicial and political thinking that the country may not need this colonial vestige any more. Section 124A of the IPC, which describes sedition, seeks to punish speech or writing that brings or tries to bring into hatred or contempt, or excites or tries to excite disaffection towards, the government established by law. Its validity was upheld by the Supreme Court as far back as 1962, but with the reservation that it would be a constitutionally permissible restriction on free speech, only if the offence was restricted to words that had a tendency to incite violence or cause public disorder. However, legal experts have pointed out that the panel's report fails to consider how far free speech jurisprudence has travelled since then. 




8. Augmentation (Noun) : वृद्धि, बढ़ोतरी

Sentence: I've always believed that the carrot-and-stick method is the best way to achieve results with your team.




10. As genuine as a three-dollar bill (Idiom)
