1. Curtail (Noun) : कटौती

Meaning: To reduce or restrict; to cut short or diminish.

Synonyms: Reduce, decrease, limit, restrict, shorten

Antonyms: Expand, increase, extend, amplify

Sentence: The company had to curtail its expenses in order to stay within the budget.

2. Redress (Verb/Noun): सुधार करना

Meaning: **remedy, correct, or make amends for wrongdoing or injustice; compensation for a wrong or grievance.**

Synonyms: **Rectify, repair**

Antonyms: **Aggravate, worsen, exacerbate**

Sentence: **The organization is working towards providing redress to the victims of the fraud.**

3. Wanton (Adj.): अकारण

Meaning: Showing no care or concern for others; reckless

Synonyms: Reckless, malicious, cruel, irresponsible

Antonyms: Careful, responsible, conscientious, considerate

Sentence: The wanton destruction of the property angered the community.

4. Sporadic (Adj.): छिटपुट

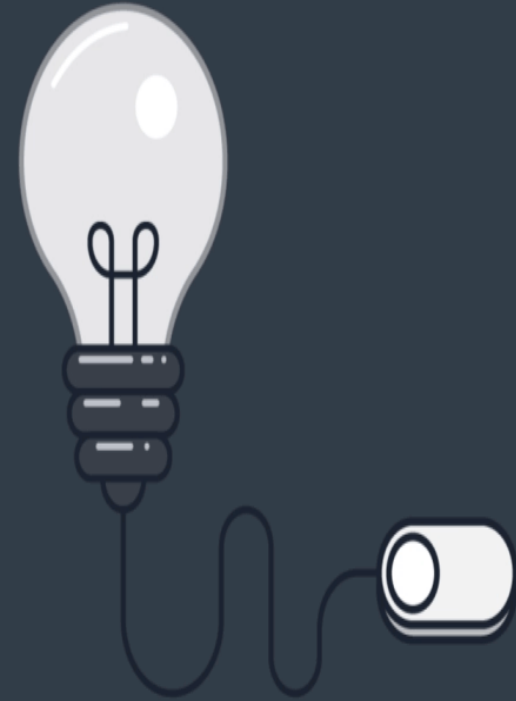


Meaning: **Occurring irregularly or infrequently; scattered or isolated in occurrence.**

Synonyms: **Infrequent, occasional, intermittent, scattered, isolated, irregular**

Antonyms: **Regular, constant, continuous, frequent, consistent**

Sentence: **The company experienced sporadic power outages throughout the day, causing disruptions in their operations.**





5. Extrapolate (Verb): आउटपुट निर्धारित करना

Meaning: To estimate or deduce something by extending or projecting known information, or to infer something from what is already known

Synonyms: derive, infer, deduce, guess, assume

Antonyms: Disregard, Ignore, Neglect

Sentence: The researchers were able to extrapolate the expected results based on previous experiments.





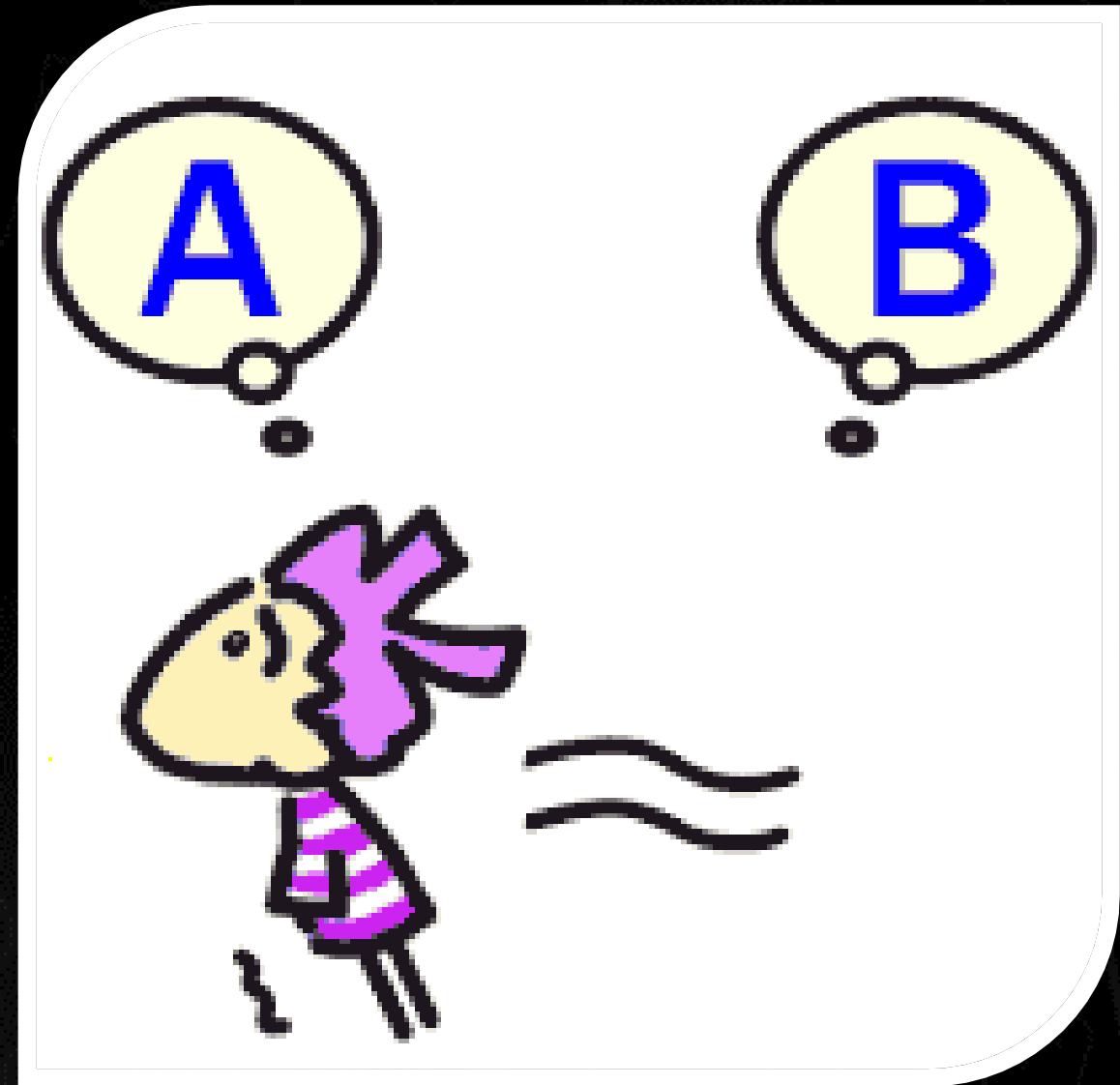
6. Vacillate (Verb): डगमगाना

Meaning: To be indecisive or wavering, to sway or hesitate between options

Synonyms: Hesitate, Waver, Fluctuate, Dither, Dilly-dally

Antonyms: Decide, Commit, Resolve

Sentence: She vacillated between two colleges, unable to decide which one to attend.





7. A Red Letter Day (Idiom)

Meaning: A highly significant or memorable day; a day of special importance or achievement.

Synonyms: Memorable day, special day, milestone, important occasion

Antonym: Ordinary day, unremarkable day

Sentence: Graduation day was a red-letter day for Sarah as she finally achieved her long-awaited degree.





8. Shook In Their Shoes (Idiom)

Meaning: To be extremely afraid or frightened; to experience intense fear or apprehension.

Synonyms: Tremble with fear, quiver in fear, be terrified, be petrified

Antonym: Fearless, courageous, brave

Sentence: When the thunderstorm began, the little child was so scared that they ^{did} shook in their ^{shoes} shoes.
