The poor performance of the team left the coach in dismay, wondering what went wrong.



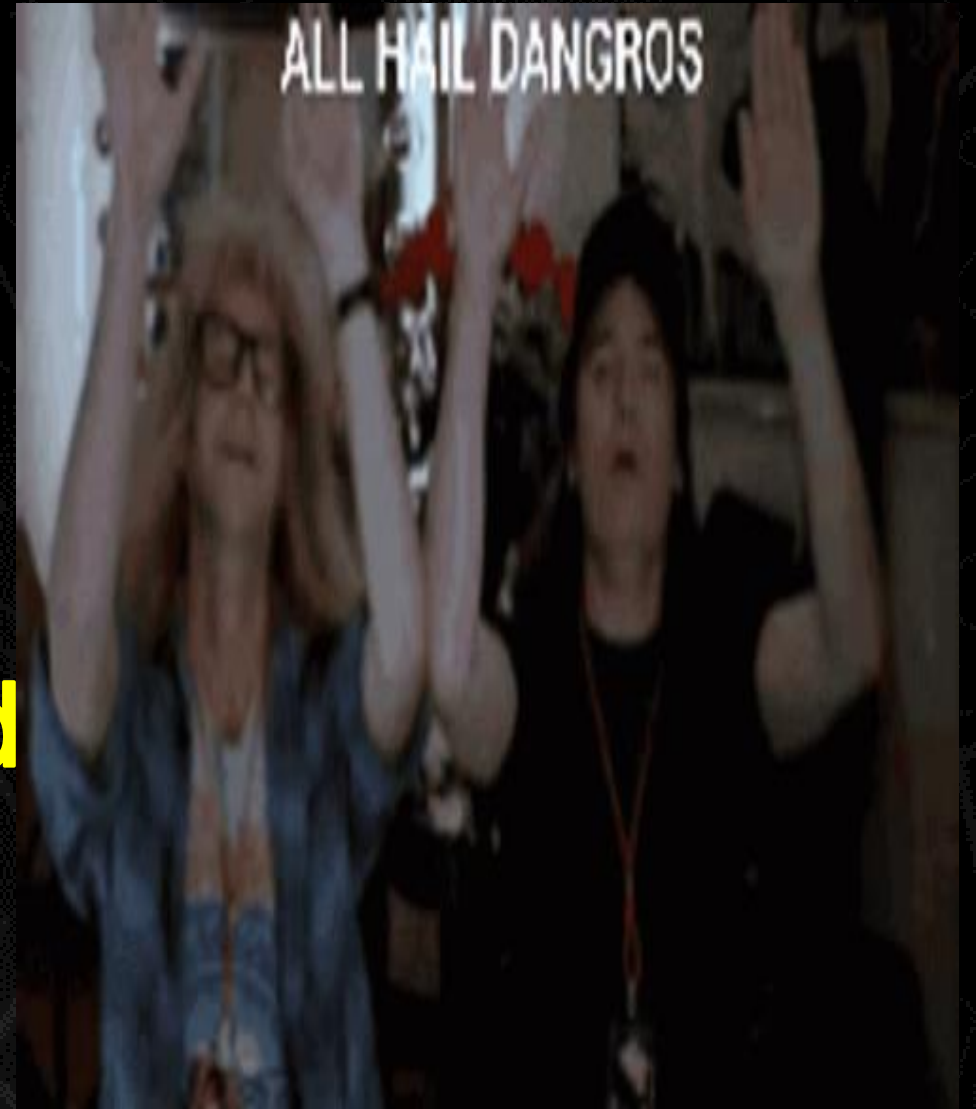


## HAIL (VERB)

Meaning: (प्रशंसा करना):  
**acclaim**

Synonyms: **praise, applaud**

Antonyms: **criticize**

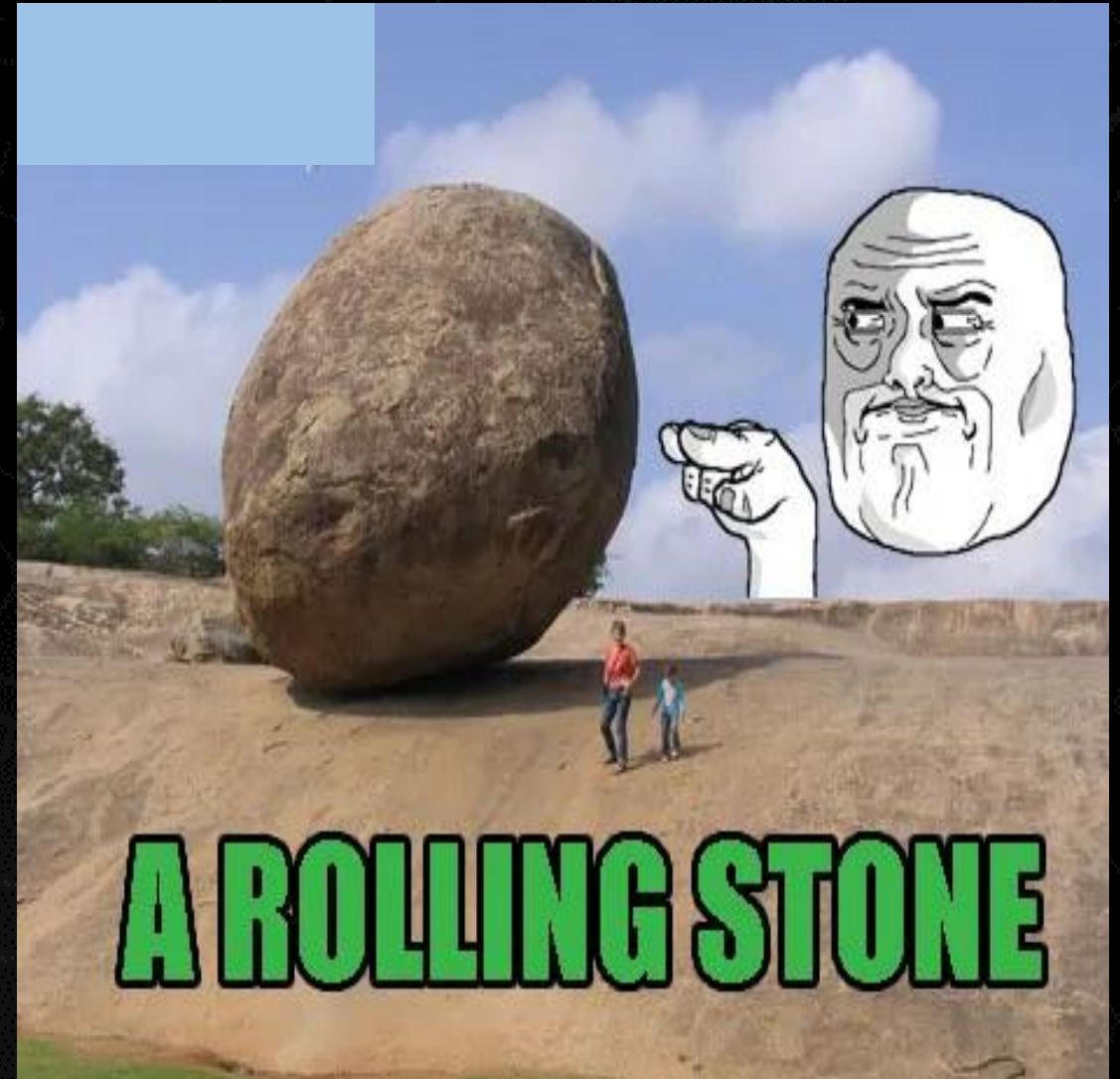
