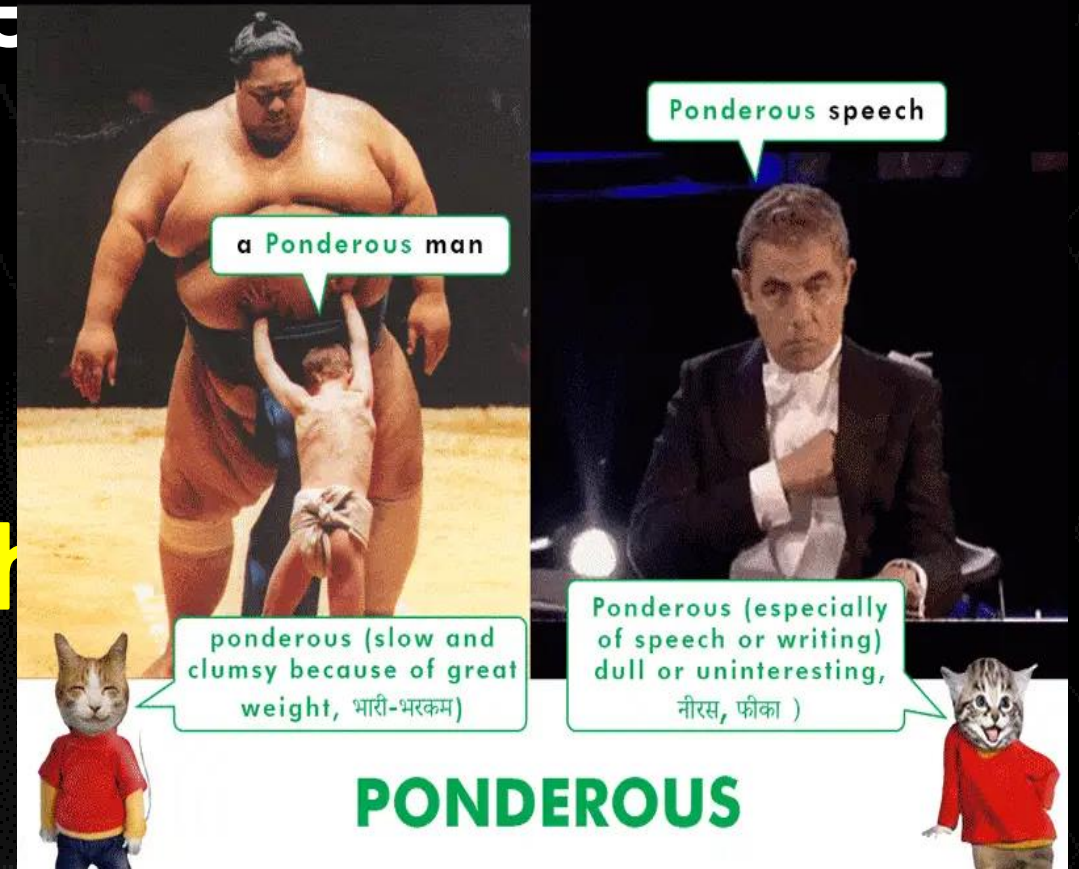


# PONDEROUS (Adjective)

**Gorge** (a narrow valley between hills or mountains)

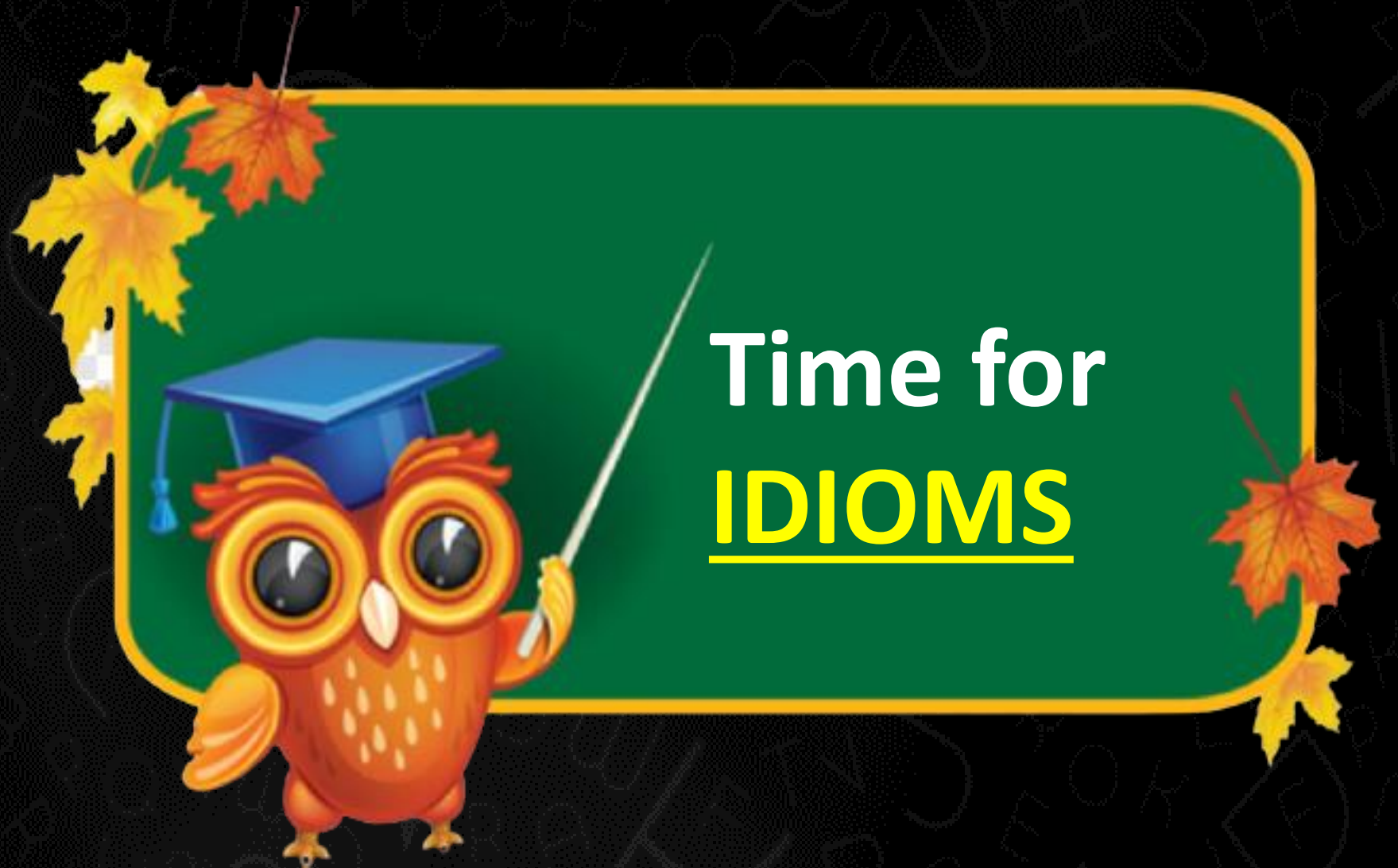
