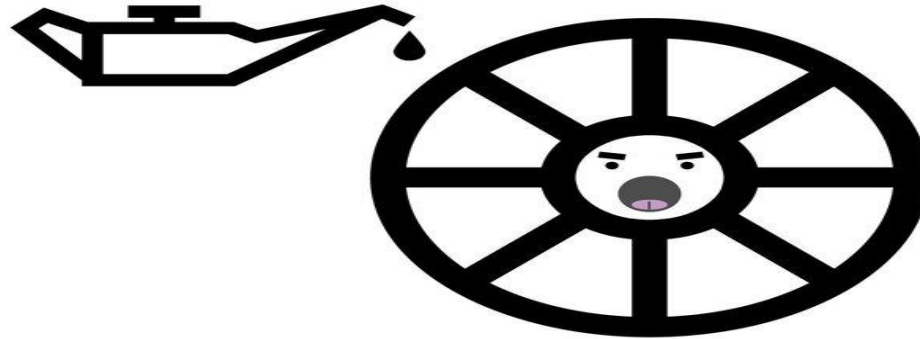

"He's a couch potato. He spends all of his time on the sofa watching Game of Thrones."

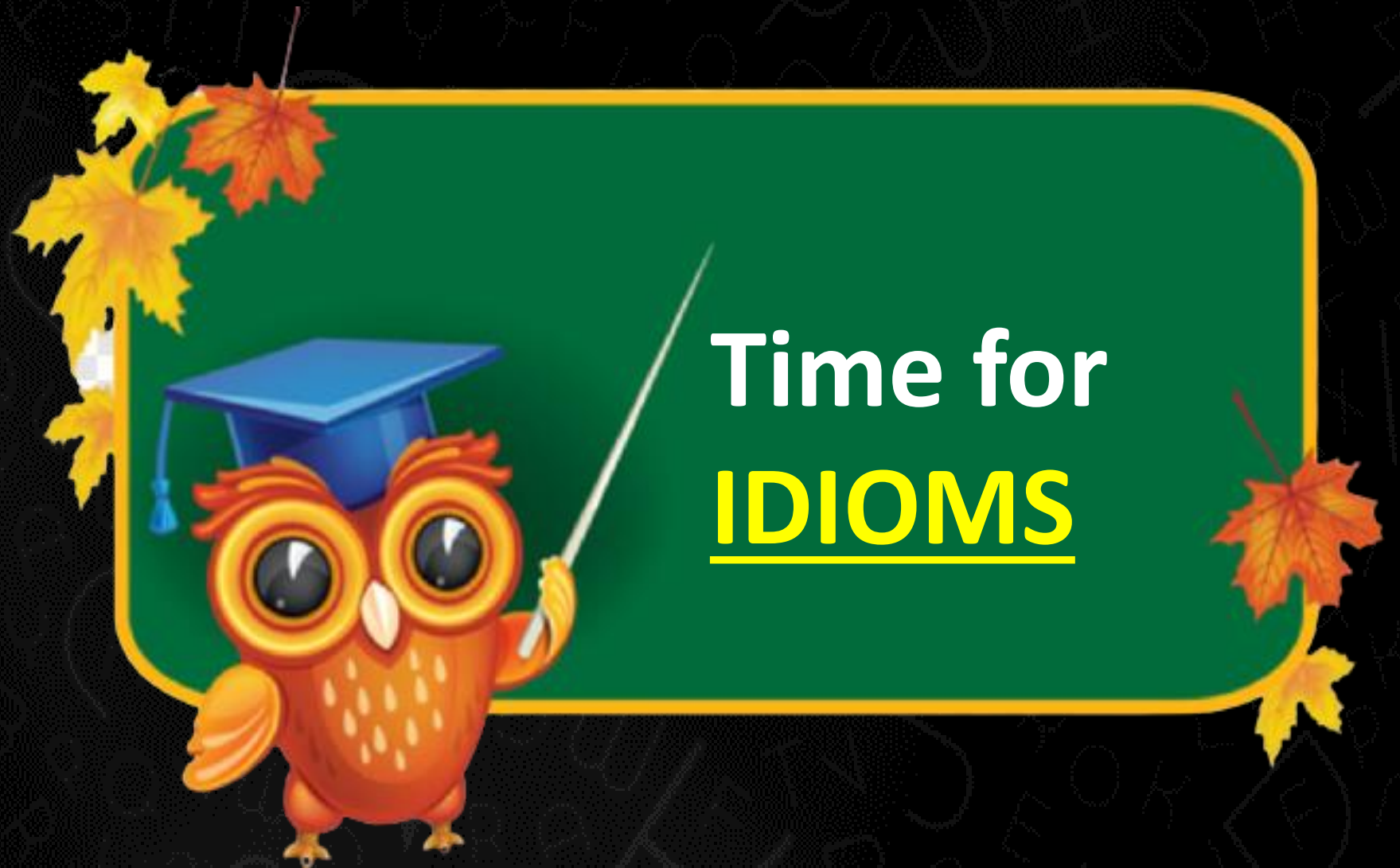
"Wow! You spent 6 hours on the sofa today. You're such a couch potato. Lazy ass!"

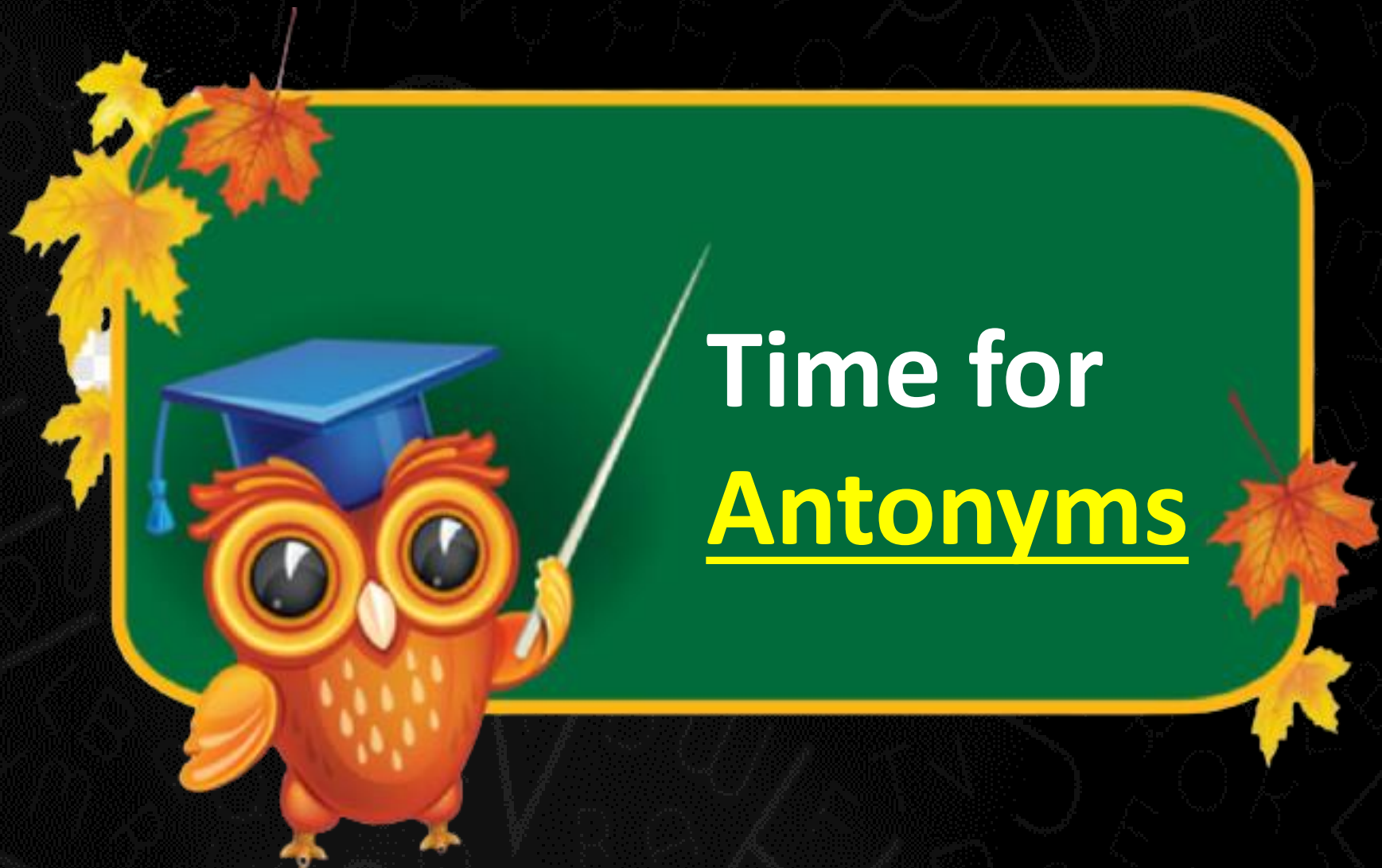
